**Milepost 64:** A stop on the African wagon trail, Eldoret was known simply as Milepost 64. Today, Eldoret is the major town in western Kenya and still serves as a transportation cross road. From the borders of Uganda to Lake Victoria to the vast Kenyan deserts that border Sudan, pastors converged upon Eldoret. Often traveling by bicycle, matatu (bus) or on foot, these conferences are often the only training, encouragement and fellowship the pastors receive.

astors are taking the teaching throughout Kenya: In addition to teaching and encouraging pastors, a primary goal of the conferences is for the pastors to take the material back to their homes to teach their leaders and churches. This requires a presentation of the material in a culturally relevant format that can be easily understood by the pastors. We select groups of key pastors, disciple them and impart to them the knowledge to teach and train others. Through this process we are able to multiply the effects of the conferences.

With little more than a vision and a heart for people, John started a church. He had been saved only a few years and had no pastoral or ministry training. The church he pastors has tripled in size in the past eighteen months. As the church has increased in numbers, the tithes and offerings have also increased, helping John to move away from his life of poverty and to take care of his family. John attributes the teaching, training and encouragement received in the conferences for the growth in his church.

hildren's Feeding Program: In the past vear the number of children being fed has increased to almost six hundred children. Most of these children are street children, who either have no parents or who have been thrown into the streets like rubbish by families that did not want them. Last March when we began to help the children, fewer than one hundred children were fed one bowl of porridge each week. Today they receive a nutritious meal six days per week. addition, fifty-seven children are currently housed on the church compound in a makeshift orphanage. When the children come to receive their food, they are taught the Word of God and basic educational skills. Perhaps the most wonderful testimony is that children are being saved every day.

In addition to providing a permanent location for the feeding program with a kitchen and dining hall, an orphanage can be built for the children. The cost of the lot is \$20,000.
