The churches in Latvia are growing, including the three churches highlighted below. Additionally, the former "greenhouse" church is now meeting in their new church building.

Jurmala Church: Formerly a Communist party *resort*, Jurmala has a population of 90,000. Communist repression and control of churches was more severe in Latvia than other Baltic states due to the large military presence and prevalence of Russian Communist settlers.





The two photos at right depict the apartment complex we lived in (3rd floor) and Becky with Natasha, who was one of our neighbors.





Jelgava Church: Sixteen years ago we moved to what was then the Soviet Union and lived in the city of Jelgava. Page 2 of this newsletter provides a pictorial tour of our apartment complex and some of the shopping experience that has changed little. One early memory is going to the 7-Eleven ... at any given time the grocery stores had between seven and eleven items.
