Each night hundreds respond to the gospel

Burkina Faso Crusade: Steep increases in the price of food resulted in riots prior to the crusade. Even though the people could not afford bread, the Bread of Life is a free gift. Burkina Faso has been a battle ground for more than a thousand years. It was here that the Mossi Kingdom defended its religious beliefs and customs from the invasion of Muslims across the Mali border. It was in this unsettled land that we conducted a crusade with hundreds of people responding to the gospel each night.

Daily Miracles: Beginning with the salvation of Muslims and the healing of a blind woman, our entire ministry in Burkina Faso was accompanied by miracles. Radio is the most popular news medium in the country and people came from towns and villages to the crusade as a result of daily radio broadcasts. The village chief, leaders of the Islamic community, the Catholic priest, protestant leaders and the local witch doctor all attended the conference to hear the gospel preached.

Congo Disaster Aid

Recently an airplane crashed into the area of one of our churches in Congo, killing four members of our church. We were able to provide funds for the funerals and for immediate food and financial aid to each of the families affected by the tragedy.

North Africa Crusade in Islamic Region

In August and September Bruce will be in North Africa conducting a crusade and establishing a new church in a strong Islamic region. The decline of the dollar combined with an inflation rate exceeding 300% has significantly affected our ministry. This increase of costs comes at a time when we have suffered a decline in contributions due to the slowdown of the U.S. economy.
