Volcano Comes To Life: Seven volcanoes surround Goma, DR Congo. During a crusade we held one of the volcanoes came to life and eventually erupted. Over the past three years, thousands of people have been saved in Goma through our crusades. Many of those saved are now in heaven as a result of their response to the gospel message. The boy accepted Jesus and his eternal hope is bright. He has a future!

THE REGIONS BEYOND. . . Sudan . . . We are making tentative plans for reaching into Sudan, which would initially involve pastoral training and a "big meeting." **Burundi. . .** There is a three week session in the pastor's training school in Burundi. Pastors from Burundi, Rwanda and DR Congo will attend. **Ethiopia . . .** Plans are being finalized for the next two pastor's conferences. **Latvia . . .** Plans are underway for a pastors and leaders conference to be held in Latvia. **Pygmies . . .** As we were preparing to leave for the DR Congo crusade, there were reports of rebel activity in the pygmy villages in which rebel soldiers were "eating" pygmies.
